

Bottles included in shipments of medical supplies must




have an all plastic lid.

- Remove labels, • leaving no glue or residue.
- Wash bottles in verv hot water and dish soap.
- Rinse and dry thoroughly.
- Replace lids on clean, dried bottles.
- Place clean, recapped bottles in ziplock bags "Clean marked Bottles." These will be blended with medical supplies. Un-<u>bagged</u> bottles will be recycled.

Recipe Corner

Witches Fingers

Ingredients

- 1 (11-oz.) can Pillsbury[™] Refrigerated Breadsticks
- **6** small slices pepperoni
- 12 (2/3-oz.) slices cheese
- 3/4 cup finely shredded lettuce

Preparation

- Heat oven to 375°F. Separate dough into 12 strips. Place flat on ungreased cookie sheet; do not twist. With sharp knife or kitchen scissors, cut 2 small triangles from one end of each dough strip to form a point that resembles a fingertip. Lightly score breadsticks in center to resemble knuckles.
- Cut each pepperoni slice into 2 pointed ovals to resemble 2 fingernails. Place 1 pepperoni piece on each breadstick.
- Bake at 375°F. for 13 to 15 minutes or until golden brown. If necessary, reapply "fingernails" with small dot of ketchup.
- Split each breadstick. Cut each cheese slice into strips and place in breadstick, overlapping strips. Top each with lettuce. If desired, serve with mustard, mayonnaise or ketchup. Serve warm or cold.



Taco Soup

Ingredients

- 1 lb. Hamburger
- **1** small onion, chopped
- **1** Taco seasoning packet
- **1** 15 oz. can each of Kidney Beans, Black Beans, Corn, Diced Tomatoes (undrained)
- **1** 8oz. can Tomato Sauce

Preparation

- Brown hamburger and onion. Drain.
- Add remainder of ingredients and simmer over medium heat for 10 minutes.
- Serve with shredded cheese, sour cream, avocadoes, and corn chips.
