Medicine Bottle Recycling

The Conservation CSP collecting empty is plastic pill bottles for Matthew 25: Ministries (m25m.org). We acdonations cept of empty plastic pill bottles for inclusion in shipments of medical supplies and for shredding and recycling. Their pill bottle program fulfills the dual needs of improving medical care in developing countries and caring for our environment.

Acceptable collection items include:

- Prescription and over-the-counter pill bottles
- Large and small pill bottles
- Pill Bottles with and without secure caps (child resistant)

Pill bottles that are not appropriate to include with shipments of medical supplies are recycled for cash that goes towards Matthew 25: Ministries' programs.

If you wish to prepare bottles for shipment rather than recycling, please adhere to the following guidelines:

- Bottles included in shipments of medical supplies must have an all plastic lid.
- Remove labels, leaving no glue or residue.
- **Wash** bottles in very hot water and dish soap.
- Rinse and dry thoroughly.



- Replace lids on clean, dried bottles.
- Place clean, recapped bottles in lock zip bags "Clean marked Bottles." These will be blended with medical supplies. Unbagged <u>bottles will be re-</u> cycled.



We would also like to encourage you to dispose of your old medications at the Clayton Police Department. There is a collection box. These can be any type of medications (prescription, over-the -counter, liquid, pill, etc.).

Please don't flush your medications!



Recipe Corner

Penne Pasta Bake

- Ingredients
- 1 lb ground beef
- 1 medium onion, chopped
- 2 1/2 cups (8 oz) penne pasta, cooked and drained
- 3/4 tsp salt
- 1/4 tsp pepper
- 1 jar (24 oz) chunky vegetable pasta sauce
- 1 cup ricotta cheese
- 1 egg
- 2 cups shredded mozzarella or Italian cheese blend (8 oz)

Directions

- 1. Heat oven to 350 degrees. In 5-quart Dutch oven, cook beef and onion over medium-high heat 5-7minutes, stirring frequently, until thoroughly cooked; drain. Stir in cooked pasta, salt, pepper and pasta sauce.
- 2. In medium bowl, mix ricotta cheese, egg and 3/4 cup of the mozzarella cheese. Spray 13x9 inch baking dish with cooking spray.
- 3. Spoon half of pasta mixture (about 3 1/2 cups) into bottom of baking dish. Spoon ricotta mixture evenly over pasta mixture in baking dish. Top with remaining pasta mixture; sprinkle with remaining 1 1/4 cups of cheese
- 4. Spray piece of foil large enough to cover baking dish with cooking spray. Cover baking dish with foil, sprayed side down. Bake 35 to 40 minutes or until heated through and cheese is melted.
- 5. To Make Ahead: Wrap foil-covered casserole in double layer of plastic wrap; label and freeze up to 3 months. To thaw and bake: Thaw overnight or until completely thawed in refrigerator. Remove plastic. Bake 50-60 minutes or until center is hot (165 degrees) and cheese is melted. To bake from freezer (no thawing): Heat oven to 350 degrees. Remove plastic. Bake 1 hour 20 minutes to 1 hour 30 minutes or until center is hot (165 degrees) and cheese is melted.

I hereby call the membership of the GFWC of North Carolina, Inc. to send duly elected delegates and representatives to meet at the Hilton Garden Inn Raleigh-Cary, NC, April 27-28, 2018.

Dottie Jennings, GFWC-NC President GFWC-NC BYLAW - ARTICLE XI

Section 11.3. A Club having between 5 and 9 members shall be entitled to be represented by its President or her representative as its delegate. A Club having between 10 and 25 members shall be entitled to be represented by its President or her representative as its delegate and one additional delegate. A Club having more than 25 members shall be entitled to one additional delegate for each additional 25 members or majority thereof after the first 25.

Section 11.4. Members of the GFWC-NC entitled to vote shall be the Executive Committee, Junior Officers, Board of Trustees, Chaplain, Parliamentarian, Historian, Protocol Chairman, Community Service Program Chairmen, Arts Festival Contest Chairmen, Chairmen and members of Standing and Special Committees, Chairmen of Special Projects; District Presidents, Vice Presidents, Junior Directors, and Junior Membership Chairmen;

GFWC-NC Past Presidents and Directors of Junior Clubs who are members of federated NC clubs; members serving GFWC in an official capacity; and club delegates. No proxies shall be permitted.
