Women have been important members of the U.S. astronaut corps. Three very special astronauts served during the 1990s. Eileen Collins was the first female shuttle commander. Shannon Lucid was the first American woman aboard the Russian space station Mir. Mae Jemison was the first black female astronaut. Recipe Corner—Breads

Baked Cheese Bread

- **Ingredients** 2 cups finely grated sharp Cheddar cheese
- 1 cup butter, softened
- 2 tablespoons heavy cream
- 1 large egg
- 1 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce
- 1/2 teaspoon table salt
- 1/2 teaspoon dry mustard

Ground red pepper or hot sauce to taste 1 (16-oz.) package firm white sandwich bread slices

Instructions:

- Preheat oven to 375°. Beat cheese and butter at medium speed with an electric mixer until blended. Beat in cream and next 5 ingredients.
- Cut crusts from bread slices; cut each bread slice into 4 squares. Spread cheese mixture on half of bread squares (about 1 tsp. per square); top each with 1 remaining square. Spread remaining cheese mixture over top and sides of sandwiches. Place sandwiches, 1 inch apart, on a lightly greased baking sheet.
- Bake at 375° for 15 minutes or until golden brown.

Note: We tested with Pepperidge Farm White Sandwich Bread.

Baked Cornbread

Ingredients

- 1 cup yellow cornmeal (not cornmeal mix)
- 1 cup all purpose flour
- 4 tablespoons sugar
- 4 teaspoons baking powder
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 cup buttermilk 1 egg

1/4 cup oil plus about 3 tablespoons for skillet

Instructions:

- Preheat oven to 375°F. Place 3 tablespoons oil in iron skillet and let it heat up in the oven while you prepare the batter.
- Mix all dry ingredients with a whisk. Add all your wet ingredients and stir until well mixed. When skillet is sizzling put batter in and bake in oven until golden brown, about 20-30 minutes.

Easy No Yeast Dinner Rolls

Ingredients

- 1 cup flour
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 cup milk

2 tablespoons mayonnaise

Instructions:

- Combine all ingredients. Spoon into a greased muffin pan. Makes approximately 5 rolls.
- Cook in a preheated 400° oven for 15 minutes or until golden brown.

Recipe Corner—Breads

Banana Bread

- **Ingredients** 3 bananas
- 1 cup sugar
- 1/2 cup butter 2 cups flour
- 1 tsp baking powder
- 1 tsp baking soda
- 1 tsp salt
- 2 eggs

Instructions:

- Mash bananas; add sugar and let set for 15 minutes.
- Melt butter and add melted butter to banana and sugar mixture.
- Mix in dry ingredients.
- Add eggs and mix only until blended.
- Bake at 350°; 50-60 minutes

Pumpkin Muffins

Ingredients 2¹/₄ cups all-purpose flour (about 10 ounces) 2 teaspoons pumpkin pie spice 1¹/₂ teaspoons baking soda 1 teaspoon ground ginger 1/4 teaspoon salt 1 cup golden raisins 1 cup packed brown sugar 1 cup canned pumpkin 1/3 cup buttermilk 1/3 cup canola oil 1/4 cup molasses 1 teaspoon vanilla extract 2 large eggs Cooking spray 2 tablespoons granulated sugar

Instructions:

- Preheat the oven to 400°F.
- Combine the flour, pumpkin pie spice, baking soda, ginger, and salt in a medium bowl, stirring well with a whisk.
- Stir in the raisins and make a well in the center of the mixture.
- Combine the brown sugar and the next six ingredients (through eggs), stirring well with a whisk.
- Spoon the batter into 18 muffin cups coated with cooking spray.
 - Sprinkle the muffins with granulated sugar.
- Bake at 400°F for 20 minutes.
- Remove the muffins from pans immediately and enjoy!

Yield: 18 servings







GFWC-NC BYLAW - ARTICLE XI

Section 11.3. A Club having between 5 and 9 members shall be entitled to be represented by its President or her representative as its delegate. A Club having between 10 and 25 members shall be entitled to be represented by its President or her representative as its delegate and one additional delegate. A Club having more than 25 members shall be entitled to one additional delegate for each additional 25 members or majority thereof after the first 25.

Section 11.4. Members of the GFWC-NC entitled to vote shall be the Executive Committee, Junior Officers, Board of Trustees, Chaplain, Parliamentarian, Historian, Protocol Chairman, Community Service Program Chairmen, Arts Festival Contest Chairmen, Chairmen and members of Standing and Special Committees, Chairmen of Special Projects; District Presidents, Vice Presidents, Junior Directors, and Junior Membership Chairmen; GFWC-NC Past Presidents and Directors of Junior Clubs who are members of federated NC clubs; members serving GFWC in an official capacity; and club delegates. No proxies shall be permitted.
