Recipe Corner—Appetizers

Baked Brie with Pecans

Ingredients

1 small wheel of Brie or Camembert (about 9 ounces) 1/2 cup pecan pieces 3 tablespoons light-brown sugar 3 tablespoons pure maple syrup Crackers or sliced baguette, for serving

Directions

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Place cheese on a rimmed baking sheet; bake until softened, 15 to 20 minutes. Transfer to a serving plate; cool about 20 minutes.
- 2. While cheese cools, place nuts on a clean baking sheet; bake until toasted and fragrant, 7 to 10 minutes. Sprinkle nuts over cheese.
- 3. In a small saucepan, combine sugar and maple syrup. Bring to a boil over medium heat; simmer until foamy, 1 to 2 minutes. Drizzle warm sauce over slightly cooled cheese and nuts; serve with crackers or baguette

Shrimp Remoulade

Ingredients $1 \frac{1}{2}$ lb. Shrimp with tails, chilled ¹/₄ Cup Mayonnaise 1/4 Cup Vegetable Oil 3 T. Dijon Mustard 1 or 2 T. Horseradish 1 T. Lemon Juice 2 tsp. Chopped fresh parsley 1 tsp. Red wine vinegar 1/2 tsp. Paprika 2 cloves garlic, crushed

Directions

Combine Mayo and next 8 ingredients in electric blender container. Process on high speed till blended; chill. Serve Remoulade sauce as a dip for the shrimp. Garnish with lemon wedges or parsley sprigs.

Homemade Beef Stick

Ingredients

2 lb ground chuck – 80% lean 2 T Tender Quick Salt (probably need to get from food specialty store) 1/4 tsp onion powder 1/2 tsp garlic salt 1 cup water 1 ½ tsp Hickory Liquid Smoke 1 T Mustard Seed

- 1 T coarsely ground black pepper

Directions

Mix well and roll into 5 rolls (silver dollar size). Use 1 C of meat per roll. Wrap in Saran Wrap and then foil (air tight). Refrigerate 24 hours. Unwrap and bake in broiler pan for 1 hour at 300 degrees. It is important to place beef stick on broiler rack. If just placed in pan it will get hard. Turn beef stick over after 30 minutes. Freezes well up to 3-4 months.

Endive with Goat Cheese, Walnuts and Honey

Inaredients

2 heads endive 8 oz. soft goat cheese 3 T walnuts, chopped Honey

Directions

Separate endive leaves. Arrange large, outer leaves on a serving platter. Spoon a teaspoon of goat cheese on each leaf, sprinkle with walnuts and drizzle honey.
