



Recipe Corner—Snack Foods

Caramel Corn

Ingredients

12-13 cups of popped popcorn (I use 2-2 1/2 microwave bags) 1 cup brown sugar 1 stick of butter 1/4 cup corn syrup (light or dark will work) 1/2 tsp salt 1/2 tsp baking soda

Instructions:

- Pop popcorn and put in large bowl or pan (I use my spaghetti pan)
- Mix next 4 ingredients in a medium sauce pan. Heat on medium heat until just boiling.
- Add 1/2 tsp baking soda (it will foam and increase so make sure you use a large enough saucepan
- Mix well with popcorn. Spread a single layer on a baking sheet (sometimes you need two sheets).
- Bake for ONE HOUR on a 200 degree oven.
- Stir occasionally during that hour.

Dry Salad

Ingredients

- 1 cup pecans quartered
- 2 cups peanuts (dry roasted unsalted)
- 1 box Cheerios
- 1 ½ bags Pretzels (I use butter pretzels; mini pretzels)
- 1 box each, Rice Chex, Wheat Chex, Corn Chex
- 3 sticks butter
- 6 T Worchester Sauce
- 2 tsp onion salt
- 2 tsp celery salt
- 2 T garlic salt

Instructions:

Clean out kitchen sink and air dry.

Melt butter. Add Worchester sauce, onion, celery and garlic salt.
Slowly pour mixture over cereals and nuts and mix together with hands.
Put mixture in large baking pans (Note: Do not use broiler pan)
Heat in 250 degree oven for 1 hour and 30 minutes being sure to stir every 20 minutes.

Let cool and store in tin cans.

Snack Mix

Ingredients

- 1 (16 oz) jar dry roasted peanuts
- 1 (15 oz) pkg raisins
- 1 (12 oz) pkg butterscotch or peanut morsels
 - 1 (11.5 oz) pkg white and/or milk chocolate morsels
 - 1 pkg Christmas M&M's

Instructions:

Combine all ingredients in large bowl; stir well. Store in airtight container at room temperature.
