Other items covered in the meeting:

- A representative from UNC Healthcare announced a new **Johnston County Health Study** that will concentrate on falls, obesity, etc. and their impact on osteoarthritis. Persons age 35-70 will be included in the study.
- **4 guests** were introduced.
- Members voted on **Club Women awards**. Winners will be announced at the January meeting.

## Public Issues CSP

2020 is a big election year and members are encouraged to **exercise their right to vote**—both in the primary election to be held **March 3rd** and the general election on **November 3rd**.

If you are not already registered to vote, you may register to vote in Johnston County if you are:

- A citizen of the United States (if convicted of a felony, citizenship rights must have been restored).
- A person 18 years of age or older.
- A legal resident of Johnston County for 30 days by the date of the next election.

Johnston County has a permanent registration system. You need to register, transfer, or re-register **ONLY** if you:

- Have not registered in Johnston County before.
- Have moved to a different voting precinct since you registered in Johnston County. If you move, it is a violation of the law to return to your old precinct after 30 days.
- Wish to change your party affiliation.
- Have changed your name.

You may obtain registration forms at the following locations in Johnston County:

- Board of Elections Office, 205 South Second Street, Smithfield, NC (Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.)
- Public Libraries during regular hours
- Public locations including the Chamber of Commerce and political headquarters
- Various Town Halls
- Drivers License Offices
- High Schools
- Various Agencies (Social Services, Agencies dealing with people with disabilities, Employment Security Commission, Armed Forces Recruitment Offices)
- You may also request a registration form by phone or mail from:

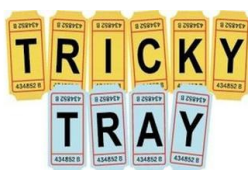

## Recipe Corner—Soups



### Cream of Mushroom Soup

#### Ingredients

6 Tablespoons Butter  
6 Tablespoons Flour  
4 Teaspoons Salt  
Dash, ground Cayenne Pepper  
8 Cups Chicken Stock  
2 Pounds Mushroom, Chopped  
1 Cup Heavy Cream  
4 Teaspoons Dry Sherry  
2 Cups sliced, fresh mushrooms  
12 Tablespoons Whipped Cream  
12 Tablespoons toasted, sliced almonds



#### Directions

- **Over low heat**, melt butter in 6quart saucepan.
- **Blend** in flour. Add salt and cayenne pepper.
- **Stir** and cook over low heat 2-3 minutes. Remove from heat.
- **Stir** in stock. Mix well. Add chopped mushrooms. Simmer ingredients covered for 30 minutes.
- **Strain** soup through fine sieve into a bowl. Push mushrooms with back of spoon so that all the juice is squeezed into bowl. Throw away any remnants in sieve. (NOTE: Can stop here and then continue recipe when ready to serve)
- **Add** heavy cream to bowl (if soup is reheated) and reheat soup in saucepan. Do not boil. Stir in sherry and mix thoroughly.
- **Add** raw, sliced mushrooms. Serve immediately. Garnish each bowl of soup with 2 T. each of whipped cream and toasted, sliced almonds.

### Tomato Soup

#### Ingredients

1 tablespoon olive oil  
2 tablespoons butter, plus some softened  
butter for sandwiches  
2 onions, chopped  
4 cloves garlic, sliced *or* chopped  
2 tablespoons thyme, chopped  
Salt and pepper  
1 teaspoon ground fennel *or* fennel pollen  
(optional)  
1 rounded tablespoon sweet paprika  
2 tablespoons tomato paste  
4 cups chicken *or* vegetable stock (32 ounces), divided  
1 can San Marzano tomatoes (32 ounces)  
1/2 cup basil, torn *or* thinly sliced, with a few leaves reserved for garnish  
1/4 cup heavy cream



#### Directions

- **Heat** a medium size soup pot over medium-high heat. Add the olive oil and melt in 2 tablespoons butter. Add the onions, garlic, thyme, salt, pepper, ground fennel and paprika. Partially cover the pot and cook to soften, 10 minutes or so.
- **Stir** in the tomato paste until fragrant, 2 minutes, and deglaze the pan with 2 cups chicken stock.
- **Transfer** to a food processor; add in the tomatoes and process until smooth. (Or, use an immersion blender in the soup pot itself to combine tomatoes and stock.)
- **Pour** back into the pot and add the rest of the stock. Stir in half the basil. Simmer at a low bubble.
- **Finish** the soup by stirring the cream into the soup; serve with more basil to garnish. Do not return the soup to a boil after adding the cream.
