For those of you who have been keeping up with the grant funds we received from the **Rye Foundation**, you know that we have still to distribute the remaining one -third of the grant. We have decided to donate to four more organizations that contribute to the physical and spiritual health and well-being of children in our area. The funds will be distributed as follows:

House of Hope will receive \$2000; With Love From Jesus Clayton will receive \$2000; My Kids Club will receive \$2000; and the Backpack Buddy program at Holy Cross Lutheran Church (which supports West Clayton Elementary School) will receive the balance of the funds, \$2333. These contributions will be made over the next few weeks so that the organizations may better continue their care of the underprivi-leged children in Johnston County.



Recipe Corner—Cookies



Chocolate Crinkle Cookies

INGREDIENTS

1 3/4 c. all-purpose flour

3/4 c. unsweetened cocoa powder

1 tsp. kosher salt

1 tsp. baking powder

3/4 tsp. baking soda

1/2 c. (1 stick) butter, melted

3/4 c. granulated sugar

1/2 c. packed brown sugar

3 large eggs

Powdered sugar, for rolling

- 1. In a large bowl, combine flour, cocoa powder, salt, baking powder, and baking soda.
- 2. In a medium bowl, whisk together melted butter, sugars, and eggs until well combined. Pour into dry ingredients and mix until just combined. Cover bowl with plastic wrap and refrigerate for 2 hours.
- 3. Preheat oven to 350° and line 2 large baking sheets with parchment. Place powdered sugar in a small bowl. Scoop about 2 tablespoons of dough and roll into a ball. If dough is too sticky, wet your hands slightly to help roll dough. Roll dough into powdered sugar, coating well and then place on prepared baking sheet 2" apart. After rolling all the dough in powdered sugar, roll each piece again in powdered sugar. This will help get a more dramatic crinkle when the cookies bake.
- 4. Bake cookies until cookies puff and crack, about 14 minutes. The edges will just be set, but the cracks will still look slightly underdone. Let cool on baking sheet.

Yields 18 cookies

Healthier Oatmeal Cookies

Ingredients

1 c. quick-cooking oats

1/2 c. old-fashioned oats

1/4 c. whole-wheat flour

3/4 tsp. baking soda

1 tsp. ground cinnamon

1/2 tsp. kosher salt

1/4 c. (1/2 stick) butter, softened

1/3 c. granulated sugar

1 large egg

1 tsp. pure vanilla extract

1/2 c. applesauce

1/2 c. dried cherries

1/3 c. chopped dark chocolate, plus more for topping


Instructions

- 1. Preheat oven to 350° and line a large baking sheet with parchment paper. In a medium bowl, whisk together oats, flour, baking soda, cinnamon, and salt.
- 2. In a large bowl using a hand mixer, cream together butter and sugar until light and fluffy. Beat in egg, vanilla, and applesauce until combined. Mix in flour mixture until just combined. Fold in dried cherries and chocolate.
- 3. Using a large cooking scoop, arrange balls of dough on prepared baking sheet, 2 inches apart. Gently flatten each ball slightly. Top with more choco-
- 4. Bake until golden around edges, about 12 minutes

Yields 12 cookies

Recipe Corner—Cookies

Chocolate Oatmeal No Bake Cookies

INGREDIENTS

1/2 cup butter

2 cups sugar

1/2 cup milk

4 tablespoons cocoa

1/2 cup peanut butter

3 1/2 cups quick cooking oats

2 teaspoons vanilla

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Add first four ingredients into a sauce pan. Bring to a rolling boil and boil for 1 mi-
- Stir in next 3 ingredients. Drop onto wax paper. Let cool until set.

Molasses Sugar Cookies

Ingredients

34 cup shortening

1 cup granulated sugar

¼ cup molasses

1 egg

2 cups all-purpose flour, sifted

2 teaspoon baking soda

½ tsp. cloves

½ tsp. ginger

½ tsp. salt

1 tsp. cinnamon

Instructions

- 1. Melt shortening. Add sugar, molasses, and egg. Beat well.
- Sift flour into wet ingredients, alternating with addition of all other dry ingredients. Stir well until thoroughly combined. Chill dough in refrigerator for at least an hour.
 Preheat oven to 375°. Shape dough into 1¼ -inch balls. Roll in granulated sugar
- and place on lightly greased cookie sheet.
- 4. Bake for 8 to 10 minutes or until cookies have flattened out and are just beginning to brown at edges. Remove cookie sheet from oven and transfer cookies to wire rack and cool completely.

Yields About 4 dozen cookies

Lime Meltaways

Ingredients

3/4 cup (1 1/2 sticks) unsalted butter, room temperature

1 cup confectioners' sugar

Finely grated zest of 2 limes

2 tablespoons fresh lime juice

1 tablespoon pure vanilla extract

1 3/4 cups plus 2 tablespoons all-purpose flour

2 tablespoons cornstarch

1/4 teaspoon coarse salt

Instructions

- Put butter and 1/3 cup confectioners' sugar in the bowl of an electric mixer fitted with the whisk attachment and mix on medium speed until pale and fluffy. Add lime zest and juice and vanilla and mix until fluffy.
- Whisk together flour, cornstarch, and salt in a bowl. Add to butter mixture and mix on low speed until just combined.
- Divide dough in half. Place each half on an 8-by-12-inch sheet of parchment paper. Roll in parchment to form a log 1 1/4 inches in diameter, pressing a ruler along edge of parchment at each turn to narrow log. Refrigerate logs until cold and firm,
- 4. Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Remove parchment from logs; cut into 1/4-inch-thick rounds. Space rounds 1 inch apart on baking sheets lined with parchment paper. Bake cookies until barely golden, about 13 minutes, rotating sheets halfway through. Transfer cookies to wire racks to cool slightly, 8 to 10 minutes. While still warm, toss cookies with remaining 2/3 cup sugar in a resealable plastic bag. Cookies can be stored in airtight containers at room temperature up to 2 weeks.
