September Meeting Highlights



The first meeting of the new club year was held September 14th. The lunch meeting was hosted by the **Education & Libraries CSP**. The devotion and blessing was given by Sandy Nesselrode.

The guest speaker was **Lynn Wiss, GFWC-NC ESO Chairperson** (pictured below). Lynn gave a background on the formation of ESO and noted that TWCC is extremely active with more members than any other ESO in the State. Members can join ESO for \$2 and should contact Brenda Gay if interested in joining.



Brenda Hill welcomed new members who joined after the May meeting and 7 guests, four of whom joined at the meeting, Pamela Ballard, Tammy Wallis, Susan Mancuso and Judy Lavista.

Highlights from the meeting:

- The proposed **Bylaws changes** sent to members in the September newsletter were approved.
- Betsy Grannis reviewed projects that were completed during the summer including Rise Against Hunger, Back to School Youth Explosion, House of Hope 5K, Little Picassos@The Farmer's Market.
- Betsy Grannis announced the TWCC Theme the next 2 years, "We are on the Right Trail". Members were thanked for bringing many plastic trash bags to the meeting and were encouraged to continue collecting the bags over the next 6 months until we reach 500 pounds of plastic. At that point we will qualify for the Trex "Bags to Benches" program wherein we will receive a bench to be placed along the Mountain to Sea Trail that runs through Clayton.
- Trish Perna, Co-Chair of the Ways & Means Committee, announced fundraisers that have been approved by the Executive Board. These are covered in the Ways & Means Committee Report in this newsletter.
- Betsy Grannis noted the success of the Rye Foundation grant so efforts will be made this year to identify other grant opportunities.

- The Serve the Need Thanksgiving meal will be held this year after a 3 year hiatus due to Covid. The event will take place on November 23rd and TWCC will be responsible for supplying cranberry sauce, brownies for takeout orders, and volunteers to help serve, prepare takeout plates, seat guests, etc.
- There were many opportunities for members to sign up for various volunteer opportunities including Hospitality Committee, Silent Partners, Rise Against Hunger event, Jumpstart Read for the Record, House of Hope meals, Senior Center Bingo. The CEO CSP supported the **Johnston County Med Assist Over-the-Counter Medicine Program Giveaway** held September 24, 2022 from 9am-2pm at Johnston Medical Mall in Smithfield. \$120,000 worth of aspirin, cough syrup, allergy pills, vitamins, etc., for adults and children, were distributed. The CSP donated \$101 and provided members an opportunity to volunteer at the event.

Recipe Corner—Halloween



Original Ranch Spinach Dip Spider Bread Bowl

INGREDIENTS

1 packet (1 ounce) Hidden Valley Original Ranch Dips Mix

1 container (16 ounces) sour cream

1 box (10 ounces) frozen chopped spinach, thawed and well-drained

1 can (8 ounces) water chestnuts, rinsed, drained and chopped

1 round loaf French bread


1 bell pepper, thin sliced

1 radish

2 black olives

DIRECTIONS

 Stir together dip mix, sour cream, spinach and water chestnuts. Chill 30 minutes or until just before serving.



3. Put 4 pieces of bell pepper on each side of the bread. Use toothpicks to adhere one slice of radish topped with slice of black olive to front of bread to look like a spider.

Serve with cubed bread and vegetables.

Yields 2 cups

Halloween Veggie Tray

Ingredients

4 Bell Peppers (Yellow, Orange and 2 Red)
Multicolor Cherry Tomatoes
Cauliflower, cut into bite-size pieces
Celery, cut into 4 inch slices
Carrots, crinkle cut 4 inch slices
Store bought vegetable dip
Hummus (optional)
Basil or parsley for garnish

Instructions

 Wash and dry peppers. Remove the stem, seeds, and ribs. On 3 of the peppers, cut 3 triangles to represent eyes and nose. Cut a shape to represent the mouth. Stuff each pepper with celery.

2. Cut up one red pepper in strips to include on the veggie tray.

3. Use a paring knife to cut the word "BOO" with paring knife or use hummus to write "BOO" on the dip.

Halloween Deviled Egg Spiders

Ingredients

6 large eggs

2 tablespoons mayonnaise

1 teaspoon prepared mustard

1/8 teaspoon salt

Dash of pepper

12 black olives

12 green olives

12 parsley leaves

Instructions

1. Boil and peel eggs.

2. Cut eggs in half lengthwise, and carefully remove yolks. Mash yolks with mayonnaise. Add mustard, salt and pepper. Stir well.

3. Spoon egg yolk mixture into egg whites.

4. Slice 6 black olives and 6 green olives into 8 slices. Put 4 slices on each side of the egg and a whole olive in the middle.

5. Garnish each egg with parsley.

Yields 12 Deviled Eggs

Recipe Corner

Granny Cake

INGREDIENTS

1 1/2 cups granulated sugar

2 cups all purpose flour

1 tsp baking soda

1/2 tsp salt

1 20 oz can crushed pineapple, with juice

2 large eggs

TOPPINGS

1 cup brown sugar, packed 1 cup pecans, chopped

GLAZE

1 cup evaporated milk 1/2 cup granulated sugar

1 stick of butter


1 tsp vanilla extract

DIRECTIONS

- Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. Grease a 9x13 inch glass baking dish with nonstick cooking spray; set aside.
- 2. In a large mixing bowl, combine the granulated sugar, flour, baking soda, and salt.
- Add the eggs and crushed pineapples with juice; mix until well combined.
- Pour the cake batter into the prepared baking dish.
- Sprinkle the top of the batter with chopped pecans and then brown sugar. Bake the cake for 40-45 minutes, or until a toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean and drv.
- 6. While the cake is baking, mix the evaporated milk, granulated sugar, and butter in a medium saucepan and heat over medium heat. Bring the mixture to a boil, then remove from the heat and add vanilla; stir well and set aside.
- 7. When the cake is finished baking, poke the cake all over with a knife or the end of a wooden spoon to allow the glaze to soak in to the cake.
- Pour the hot glaze over the cake. Cool the cake completely to room temperature before serving. For best results, allow the cake to soak in the glaze for several hours, then slice and serve.
