





Recipe Corner—Superbowl Dips



Vidalia Onion Dip

INGREDIENTS

1 Tbsp butter, or as needed 1 1/4 cups chopped sweet Vidalia onion 2/3 cup mayonnaise

2 cups shredded Swiss cheese

DIRECTIONS

Preheat oven to 350 degrees

Melt butter in a skillet over medium heat. Cook and stir sweet onions in hot butter until browned, 5-7 minutes; transfer to a bowl. Add mayonnaise to the onion and stir; pour into a 9x13 inch baking dish. Sprinkle Swiss cheese over the mixture.

Bake in preheated oven until the top is bubbling and lightly golden, about 35 minutes

Yield: 4 cups

WORLDS BEST BACON CHEESE DIP

INGREDIENTS

- 4 slices bacon
- 1 (8oz) package cream cheese, softened
- 1 cup mayonnaise
- 8 oz Swiss cheese, shredded
- 2 green onions, finely chopped
- 4 buttery round crackers, crushed

DIRECTIONS

Place bacon in a large skillet. Cook over medium-high heat until evenly brown. Drain, crumble, and set aside

In a small bowl, mix the cream cheese with mayonnaise until smooth. Stir in Swiss cheese, onions, and bacon. Place bowl in microwave, and cook 2 minutes. Remove, and stir well. Return to microwave, and cook 2-4 minutes more. Sprinkle crushed crackers on top. Serve warm with crackers.

Yield: 16 servings
